Dorothy (Evans) Decker ~T.H.S. Class of 1927

Dorothy turned 100 on November 29th. In fact, she was a member of the **very first graduating class** of the newly constructed high school on South Main Street, which was built in 1926. Prior to this time, students attended Taylor's first-ever built high school, which was later renamed "Roosevelt School" on West Grove Street. Mrs. Decker tells us that she graduated from Bloomsburg Normal School in 1929, then went on to teach in a one-room schoolhouse in the *Village of Milwaukee*, Ransom Twp. Her duties included cleaning her own classroom, tending to the pot-bellied stove, while teaching fifth through eighth grades. She earned \$100.00 per month. She also paid the late Dewey Thomas of Old Forge \$15.00 per month for a ride to and from school in an old "jalopy." From 1930 until 1937 she taught in the former Taylor School District at the William Penn School, located on the east side of Keyser Avenue near Walnut Street, which was a 2-room school. She later taught first grade at the "Roosevelt School" for just three years. In 1937, she was forced to resign (by law) since she was getting married. Shortly following her resignation, the law was changed, but Dorothy went on to have 2 children and spent the next twenty years as a "housewife." In 1957 she began teaching at South Scranton's *St. Stanislaus Polish National Church* Elementary School, and finally retired for good in 1977 at the young age of 68.

Mrs. Decker tells of her youth when she remembers Union Street getting "paved" for the first time. She says that once a week, the borough would close Union Street from "Storrs" to "Pond" so that the children could roller-skate freely down the hill. She would also go to the former *Thomas Theater* on Union Street to watch Silent Movies, and spent many days at the former "Weber's Rink" where Uni-Mart now stands on Main Street across from Taylor Cemetery. This was a park-type setting where citizens would go for recreational purposes. Happy 100th Birthday, Dorothy!

**Ans:** The Thanksgiving Eve Bonfire! Traditionally, this event took place following several days of collecting wood and other combustible materials, then piling it up as high as a two-story building. This researcher learned that there have been several locations of the **BONFIRE** over the years. Sites have included present-day Derenick's Park in Taylor, the baseball field in Moosic, and the last site; the vicinity of **RHS Track** located on our upper campus. This researcher once lived near Derenick's Park (formerly referred to as "The Dump" as many of you out-of-town alumni may have known this area as), and has clear memories of Old Forge High School students sneaking up on our bonfire (prior to Thanksgiving eve) and attempting to steal our materials. This was the practice of both rival high schools during bonfire week. To "top off" both bonfires of the opposing schools (**Riverside** & **OF**), students would work hard all throughout the playing season to "obtain" a jersey of a key player, dress a stuffed dummy with the jersey, and finally place it atop the bonfire. The bonfire usually ended with great cheers when the flames ultimately reached the dummy. This moment was what all the suspense led up to! A crowd of students, parents and alumni would gather around the bonfire drinking hot chocolate, while being entertained with songs and cheers from the cheerleaders. This practice took place in the 1960's and 1970's, and came to an abrupt end when an explosion occurred in the late 1970's. It is for this reason the bonfire era ended. Although, the bonfires were not directly sponsored by the school district, everyone had an enjoyable time. If you are as lucky as this researcher, and can say you once attended a Pre-Thanksgiving Day Game Bonfire at **Riverside**, you truly felt "School Spirit" in **Viking Country**. This year, our varsity football players have given all of us **Vikings** another chance to feel the greatest spirit any high school can experience. Our hats go off to the entire team! Through your great efforts and accomplishments, you have provided "great material" for future **Riverside** historians!

### T-M Welcomes Two New Teachers

Two new teachers were added to the faculty of Taylor-Moosic High School this year. They are Mr. Paul Rusincovitch and Mr. Robert Meckwood.

Mr. Rusincovitch, who graduated from Taylor High School in 1952, was active in football as a student here. After graduating from high school, he joined the Air Force where, in addition to his regular duties, he played football and instructed in judo. At one time he seriously considered making the Air Force his career, but chose to enter the field of teaching which he considers to be a most important profession.

At the University of Scranton, he majored in mathematics and science. Upon graduation he accepted a teaching position in the public schools of Binghamton, N.Y. where he taught until his return to Taylor this year. Here at T-M, he not only teaches business math., science and algebra, but he serves on the football coaching staff as well.

Mr. Meckwood, a graduate of Scranton Preparatory School and the University of Scranton, teaches Spanish and American History. During his Prep School days, his extra curricular-activities centered around basketball and baseball. His continued interest in these sports in college resulted in his playing professional baseball with the Giants for two years.

Although his ambition had always been to play professional ball, he decided to begin the teaching career for which he had prepared in college. Coaching possibilities and the fact that he enjoys teaching Spanish attracted him to Taylor-Moosic.

To these new members of our faculty, the student body expresses its pleasure in welcoming them to our school community.

Additional Note: Although he has been retired for many years, Mr. Rusincovitch remains one of **Riverside's** most loyal fans! He can be seen on the sidelines at the games sporting his 10 gallon hat! We're glad to have him!

In the 1920's, Mary and her "schoolmates" would "march" about 1/4 mile on Keyser Avenue (which was a dirt road then) to the Taylor Primitive Methodist Church (corner of Keyser Ave. & Oak St.), and perform a **Patriotic** program for war veterans. This performance took place just days before "Decoration Day" (now called Memorial Day). Some of the veterans at this program fought in the **American Civil War**. Mary grew up in Taylor's "Archbald" section, and remembers long-time families of the borough like the Slucks and the Shimkos. Mary is now 94 years young and full of life! She left Pennsylvania in 1946, and loves coming HOME to her family in Taylor about once a year.

THE GRIDDERS OF COACH ELIO GHIGIARELLI, NEVERTHELESS, HAD TO SETTLE FOR A 6-6 STALEMATE IN A BRISTLING BATTLE WITH THE NEIGHBORING TROJANS OF TAYLOR.

SOME 4,000 BRAVED THE CRISPY WEATHER AT TAYLOR STADIUM WHICH WAS CONSPICUOUS BY THE **ABSENCE OF GOAL POSTS**. JUST WHEN AND HOW AND BY WHOM THE UPRIGHTS HAD BEEN LIFTED IS A PUZZLE STILL TO BE SOLVED.
